

Chapter 10.10 UTAH OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE ACT

10.10.010: ADOPTION OF OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE ACT:

Chapter 22 of title 41 of the Utah Code Annotated 1953, as it applies to all off highway vehicles other than snowmobiles, shall constitute the city ordinances as to the rules and regulations governing off highway vehicles (hereinafter OHV) and the same shall be construed to make them applicable as city ordinances. (Ord. 2000-4 § 1)

10.10.020: OPERATION BY PERSONS SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER:

No person sixteen (16) years or older shall operate an off highway vehicle on the designated streets of the city unless such person has valid driver's license. The violation of this provision shall be punishable as a class C misdemeanor. (Ord. 2000-4 § 1)

10.10.030: OPERATION BY PERSONS UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE:

No person under sixteen (16) years of age may operate and no owner may give permission to a person under the age of sixteen (16) to operate an off highway vehicle on the designated streets of the city unless such person is under the direct visual supervision of an adult eighteen (18) years of age or older holding a valid driver's license. The violation of this provision shall be punishable as an infraction with a maximum fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per offense. (Ord. 2000-4 § 1)

10.10.040: DESIGNATION OF OHV ROUTES:

- A. The following streets within the city of Richfield are designated as permissible routes for the use of off highway vehicles subject to all other rules and regulations outlined in this chapter:

College Avenue from 500 North to 1300 South

South Technology Drive to 1500 South and south on Cove View Road

100 East

400 West

500 East

500 North

500 South

1500 South Airport Road to 100 East

- B. The use of the above designated routes by OHV shall be exclusively for the purpose of accessing approved trails or roadways on state and federal lands outside city limits.
- C. Operation of off highway vehicles on streets or roadways within the city other than those designated above shall be authorized, but only by operators then registered as participants of an organized OHV event which event has previously obtained the necessary permit or authorization from the city.
- D. All streets within the city of Richfield except Main Street are open to street legal all-terrain vehicles that comply with the requirements in section 41-6a-1509, Utah Code Annotated.
- E. The violation of this section shall be punishable as an infraction. (Ord. 2013-2)

10.10.050: SPEED LIMITS:

The maximum speed for off highway vehicles shall be as posted for general motor vehicular traffic and the operation of off highway vehicles shall otherwise be in accordance with all applicable motor vehicle laws and regulations. The violation of this provision shall be punishable consistent with speed violations for general motor vehicles. (Ord. 2000-4 § 1)
